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

The Award Journey



1Choose your Award Level

For ages 14+

Bronze - 6 months

For ages 15+

Silver -12 months

For ages 16+

Gold - 18 months



2 Register with an Award Centre
And register on the Online Record
Book (ORB)





Pick out your Skills, Voluntary Service, Adventurous Journey, Physical Recreation, and Gold Residential Project (Gold Level only) with your Award Leader and find an Assessor for each activity.



6 Submit your Online Record Book

Once your ORB has been submitted your Award leader will approve and it will be sent off for the Award Operating Authority sign off.



5 Get you activities approved

Assessors sign off the activity they mentored you in

4 Log your activity progress in the ORB App

Log hours and keep up to date with your Assessors
